Here's a starter CELPIP Vocabulary List grouped by topics students are most likely to see in the exam.

Everyday Life

- Appliance – “We bought a new kitchen appliance yesterday.”
- Lease – “She signed a one-year lease for her apartment.”
- Maintenance – “The building requires regular maintenance.”
- Neighbourhood – “Our neighbourhood is very quiet and safe.”

Workplace & Business

- Deadline – “The report must be submitted before the deadline.”
- Colleague – “My colleague helped me finish the project.”
- Promotion – “He received a promotion last month.”
- Policy – “The company has a new vacation policy.”

Immigration & Community

- Residency – “Permanent residency is required for certain benefits.”
- Citizenship – “She applied for Canadian citizenship.”
- Community Centre – “Many events are held at the local community centre.”
- Volunteering – “Volunteering helps you gain Canadian experience.”

Health & Services


- Appointment – “I booked an appointment with the doctor.”
- Pharmacy – “The pharmacy is open 24 hours.”
- Insurance – “Health insurance is necessary in Canada.”
- Prescription – “The doctor gave me a prescription for antibiotics.”

Travel & Directions

- Commute – “My daily commute takes 45 minutes.”
- Intersection – “Turn right at the intersection.”
- Schedule – “The bus schedule has changed.”
- Transfer – “You may need to transfer to another bus.”

Common Expressions for Speaking

- “I would recommend...” (for advice tasks)
- “In my opinion...” (for giving opinion tasks)
- “One advantage is...” (for comparison tasks)
- “A possible solution could be...” (for problem-solving tasks)
